The Central Region Race Circuit....What Is it?

I mentioned the Central Region Race Circuit in the previous article and that the ADBA voted to add a Breast Cancer Survivor division to the Circuit. After that you were probably wondering what a Central Region Race Circuit is and what was offered to the Breast Cancer Survivor Teams.

Briefly, the ADBA implemented a Race Circuit last year to determine championship crews in the Central Region. This would give a crew bragging rights and an award them a Central Region Championship plaque... along with a berth at the next Club Crew World Championships or a berth at the U.S. Club Crew National Championships.

The rules are listed on the website and it is based on points earned. Any festival /

event / race with paid membership to the ADBA will be able to be awarded Central Region Championship points. Points will be awarded per a system as outlined on the ADBA website. Every festival is responsible for turning in the winning teams information to the ADBA within two weeks after their event.

Only ADBA member festivals are allowed to award points. To be an ADBA qualifying event, Affiliate Fees must be paid by June 1st of the current calendar year. To see if your BCS Team will be participating in a race that will be awarding Central Region Race Circuit points, visit the website and see which festivals, events or races are listed for the Midwest. Keep in mind that others can still be added this year until June 1, 2011. 2011 Club Crew National Championships Awarded to Midwest Site!

The United States Dragon Boat Federation (USDBF) announced that the 2011 USDBF Club Crew National Championships (CCNCs) will be held in Fort Dodge, Iowa, on August 27 and 28, 2011! How great to have this wonderful event in the Midwest! Club Crews from all across the U.S. will participate in the USDBF CCNCs to race for the title of National Champion in their division.

The USDBF and Daybreak Rotary Club of Fort Dodge, Iowa, invite you to attend the 8th USDBF U.S. Club Crew National Championships. These Championships will be conducted within the Fort Dodge Festival's Annual Badger Lake Dragon Boat Bash at Badger Lake, Kennedy Park in Fort Dodge, Iowa. As you discuss festivals and races to attend this year, don't forget to check out this exciting event being held in your own Region!

BCS crews will also be included in this exciting event. The 2011 USDBF CCNCs will be hosting the 2011 BCS National Championships and awarding the Dana Nelson Memorial Cup to the winning all-BCS member team. Dana was very committed to the sport and the BCS division and this is a Memorial Cup that is being awarded each year in her honor. The winner of the Memorial Cup must be a full BCS crew. In some regions, BCS crews also allow supporters. These survivor / supporter crews will be racing in the BCS division also but the Memorial Cup will be reserved for the winning all-BCS member team.

The Registration/Entry Form and full payment are due (online) by July 1, 2011 so you will want to check out the website soon. Also listed are the deadlines for the Named Crew List and Waivers.
